As part of the Swansea Science Festival 2022, this free event at Oriel Science offers an opportunity to learn about some of the world-class cancer research happening in Swansea and around Wales.

Taking place on Thursday 3 November from 7pm-9pm, there will be presentations from Swansea University researchers who are funded by Cancer Research Wales. These will include:

- Professor Dean Harris and Professor Peter Dunstan speaking about a revolutionary blood test that could transform the way bowel cancer is diagnosed
- Professor Gareth Jenkins presenting how DNA damage can be used to detect cancer earlier

There will also be a number of hands-on exhibits including a Pink Spanner, 3D Drug Discovery, Flow Cytometry game and a giant inflatable bowel.

In an informal setting you can meet some of Wales' leading cancer researchers and learn about their work, which is only possible thanks to the charity's dedicated supporters.
